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**5 ways to build respect with your students**

1. Respect your students.
2. Have a class agreement, not top-down rules.
3. Be part of their learning community. Model behaviors.
4. Acknowledge their physical needs.
5. Be fair and reasonable.

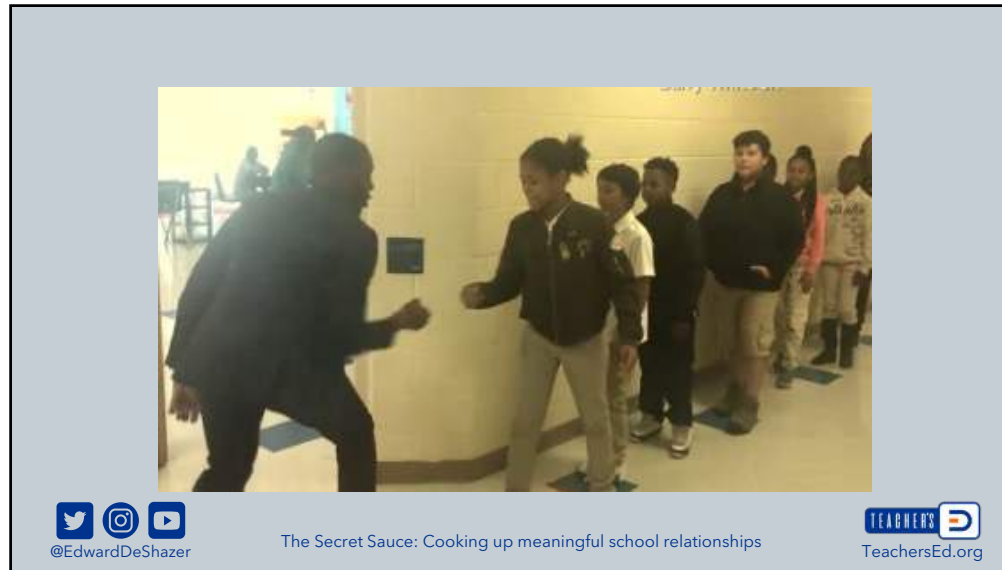
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### 4 Rules to greeting your students at the door.

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## How to Pool Party

- The pool party is a great way to build community in your classroom.

- The Pool Party is about learning about your students and they learn about each other.
- Two types of Pool Parties: Green (S,S,S) & Yellow (S, M, S) & Red ( S, M, D, M, S)
- Your first five pool parties should always be GREEN.
- For every YELLOW Pool Party, you should do three GREEN.

This type of educator can only tell you what temperature the classroom is.




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Thermostat
